THE STRADIVARIS OF IT'S ALL





A fascination with the traditional craft of violin-making has been in the Goldfuss family's blood for three generations. Their instruments are distinguished by top quality, optimum sound, and timeless beauty. Precision-crafted soundboards, backs, and masterfully carved scrolls make them highly unique pieces. Even copies of old masters modeled on those made by Antonius Stradivarius and Joseph Guarnerius del Gesu are made true-to-original here. For nearly 100 years, this establishment has dedicated itself to restoring and repairing valuable string instruments, enabling


Just like his father, Hans Weger is the third generation to have learned the trade of basket-weaving at the basket-weaving college in the Franconian town of Lichtenfels The wares on display in his store are anything but mass-produced goods. All kinds of baskets for household use, as well as picnic baskets and furniture items to last a lifetime, abound here. He makes premium, customized rattan furnishings for terraces and conservatories, along with entire seating sets. And his clients come from far and wide. Hans Weger is one of the few still proficient in complex weaving techniques, and who is able to repair the likes of historic chairs. He also enjoys sharing



his knowledge as part of weaving courses. In the middle of the store is a grand piano, and Hans Weger plays it masterfully with his magic hands. Everything he plays is self-composed. A kind man of many skills and talents.

What makes this place so special is the fact that its printing methods remain the same as those used back in Gutenberg's day. Owner Susanne Kauth describes her store, with its adjoining workshop, as a "mix of art, fine handicrafts, and puns". High-quality handmade paper is still printed on manually using bicepbuilding historic letterpress printing machines with moving lead & wooden letters and antique stereotypes. Every print – or, more specifically, every Blinkfüer letterpress card – is naturally a unique piece, boasting impressive creative design. "It's always a long process from the artistic draft to the finished hand-printed card," Ms. Kauth explains. A rarity in this fast-paced day and age, this time and effort is visibly





CHESS AS AN ART FORM: THE MARQUETRY MASTER



DER SCHACH- UND INTARSIENLADEN IM ALTSTADTQUARTIER HOTEL MÜNCHNER HOF

Marquetry is the term used to describe filigree wooden artworks. Not far from Neupfarrplatz, the shop window of master cabinetmaker Johann Zimmermann is fascinating enough in itself. After taking his Master Craftsman's Examination, he specialized in marquetry, and opened a chess and marquetry









store at the Mijnchner Hof hotel in the Old Town as early as 1972. This decorative technique involves fitting different woods together on a flat surface to create a pattern or motif. Individual wooden pieces are laid on the base material. They are then sanded down until a flat surface is achieved. You could also say Johann Zimmermann paints with wafer-thin pieces of wood, and that the scalpel is his brush Johann Zimmermann loves veneers, which he masterfully applies to his marguetry. His reputation extends well beyond Regensburg's borders - a large marguetry piece by him adorns the patent office in Munich, for example. As a "tree psychologist", Johann Zimmermann is especially interested in trees battered by wind and rain. "They have the best grain," he says. He loves unusual timbers, and searches for them right across Europe. He has been collecting these rare timbers for decades, using them to craft his unique chessboards, which are

regarded highly by connoisseurs worldwide. His store is also considered a hidden gem among DIYers, because highly attractive veneers are versatile, and practical tips are thrown in for free.

Expert bespoke tailor and fashion designer Julia Liedtke has run the Mariejuliee fashion label in Glockengasse since 2015, where she also sells her own collection, crafted specially for customers. Personal requests can similarly be catered to.

The designer places great emphasis on ensuring her clothing is sustainable and recyclable. Her philosophy is known as "Slow Fashion". New materials are chosen based on strict criteria. Even discarded clothing is transformed into unique pieces to extend the items' life cycle.

A favorite dress that has been outgrown is turned into a new favorite top, while leftover old jeans and fabric scraps are used to create unique patchwork skirts or casual jackets. "Fashion should be fair to all people and the environment," she says. Rediscover new, sustainable fashion!

But he also makes wooden lids for Alexa's lunchboxes, as well as special chopping boards and serving boards. The friendly couple complement each other perfectly, and also enjoy sharing their knowledge as part of creative courses. They have run their workshop on Weissgerbergraben in the heart of Regensburg since 2012. It's always worth a visit.



She loves beaded pouches. She has even dedicated a museum to the 200-year-old craft of "beaded-pouch embroidery". Countless pieces from her collection are on display here, and you can even watch her bead live at her "work bench".
